



Camp Merz 2010 Job Positions

Outdoor Skills Director

The main responsibility of the Outdoor Skills Director is maintaining and running the Outdoor Skills Area including special programs. As the overall Director you will be working with 2 assistant directors and 2 staff members. You will work side by side with your assistants to train staff, maintain the area, and run area specific events. You are directly responsible to oversee the planning and implementing of the merit badge sessions and are specific programs.

Assistant Outdoor Skills Director

The main responsibility of the Assistant Outdoor Skills Director is to assist the director in the running and managing of the area. You will be under the leadership of the Outdoor Skills Director, that person is directly responsible for the overseeing of the Outdoor Skills area. You will work side by side with the Outdoor Skills Director to train staff, maintain the area, and run area specific events.

Outdoor Skills Staff

As area staff you will take direction from the area director, teach merit badges, help with special programs and help with any area events.

Nature/Ecology Director

The main responsibility of the Nature/Ecology Director is maintaining and running the Nature area. As Director you will be working with people under you in one of the areas that offer the most in-depth merit badges. You are directly responsible for everything that happens at Nature ranging from everyday activities to any special events. Along with running the area you are also responsible for training and teaching the staff how to teach merit badges to the level required by Camp.

Nature/Ecology Staff

As staff members the staff is required to take direction from the Area Director and teach merit badges along with participating in the activities that your area offers.

Technology Director

The main responsibility of the Technology Director is maintaining and running the Technology area and maintaining the camp's computer networks. You are directly responsible for everything that happens at the Technology Center ranging from everyday activities, safety, and any emergency that can happen. Along with running the area you are also responsible for training and teaching the staff how to teach merit badges to the level required by Camp.

Technology Staff

As staff, this person will be responsible for assisting the Area Director. This person will be utilized by the area director to help run everyday activities and also to help run the special events.

Handicraft Director

The main responsibility of the Handicraft Director is maintaining and running the Handicraft area. As Director you will be working with staff under you in one of the most popular places in camp for the younger scouts. You are directly responsible for everything that happens at Handicraft ranging from everyday activities, safety, and any emergency that can happen. Along with running the area you are also responsible for training and teaching the staff how to teach merit badges to the level required by Camp.

Handicraft Staff

As Assistant Area Director, this person will be responsible for assisting the Area Director. This person will be utilized by the area director to help run everyday activities and also to help run the special events.

Waterfront Director

The main responsibility of the Waterfront Director is maintaining and running the Waterfront area. As Director you will be working with several people under you in one of the most heavily responsible places in camp. You are directly responsible for everything that happens at the Waterfront ranging from everyday activities, safety, and any emergency that can happen. Along with running the area you are also responsible for training and teaching the staff how to lifeguard the area and teach merit badges to the level required by Camp.

Assistant Waterfront Director

As Assistant Area Director, this person will be responsible for assisting the Area Director. This person will be utilized by the area director to help run everyday activities and also to help run the special events.

Lifeguard

As lifeguards the staff will be watching the campers during open swim and activities along with teaching merit badges as trained by the Area Director.

Shotgun/Rifle/Archery-BB Gun Instructor

The main responsibility of the Shooting Sports Instructor is maintaining and running the Shooting Sports Complex. As a instructor of your areas you will be working closely with the Shooting Sports manager in one of the most safety responsible places in camp. You are directly responsible for everything that happens in your areas ranging from everyday activities, safety, and any emergency that can happen. Along with running the area you are also responsible for teaching merit badges and awards to the level required by Camp.

Head Cook

The Head Cook is responsible for all summer camp food service operations. This includes but is not limited to menu planning, kitchen and dining hall setup, food ordering, daily meal preparation, supervision of dining hall operations, cleanup, opening and closing inventory. The head cook will have an assistant cook and 3 additional staff members in the kitchen. There will also be a dining hall steward who reports to the head cook.

Dining Hall Steward

Assists in the food preparation and clean up as assigned. Dining Hall operations and setup. Responsible for dining hall orientation for units checking into camp. Should be at least 16 years old. Reports to the Head Cook.

Dining Hall Steward

Serves food, washes dishes and maintains clean kitchen and dining hall.
Reports to the head cook.

Health Director

Live in position responsible for taking care of all camp injuries and illnesses. Chief medical and safety advisor to the Camp Director.
Responsible for OSHA Blood borne requirements. Requirements are E.M.T, LPN, or RN certified in NY. 18 years old or older. Reports to the Camp Director.
